= *concern at CHOGM*



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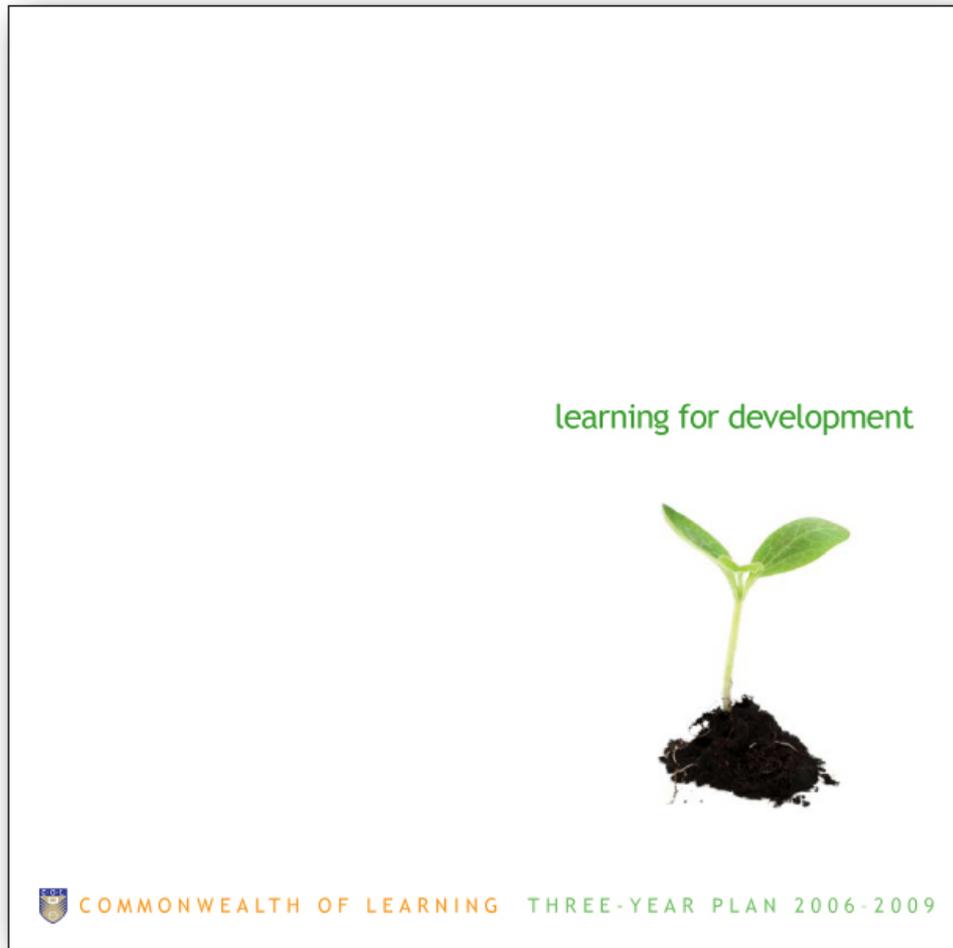
EVALUATION

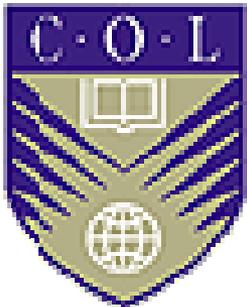

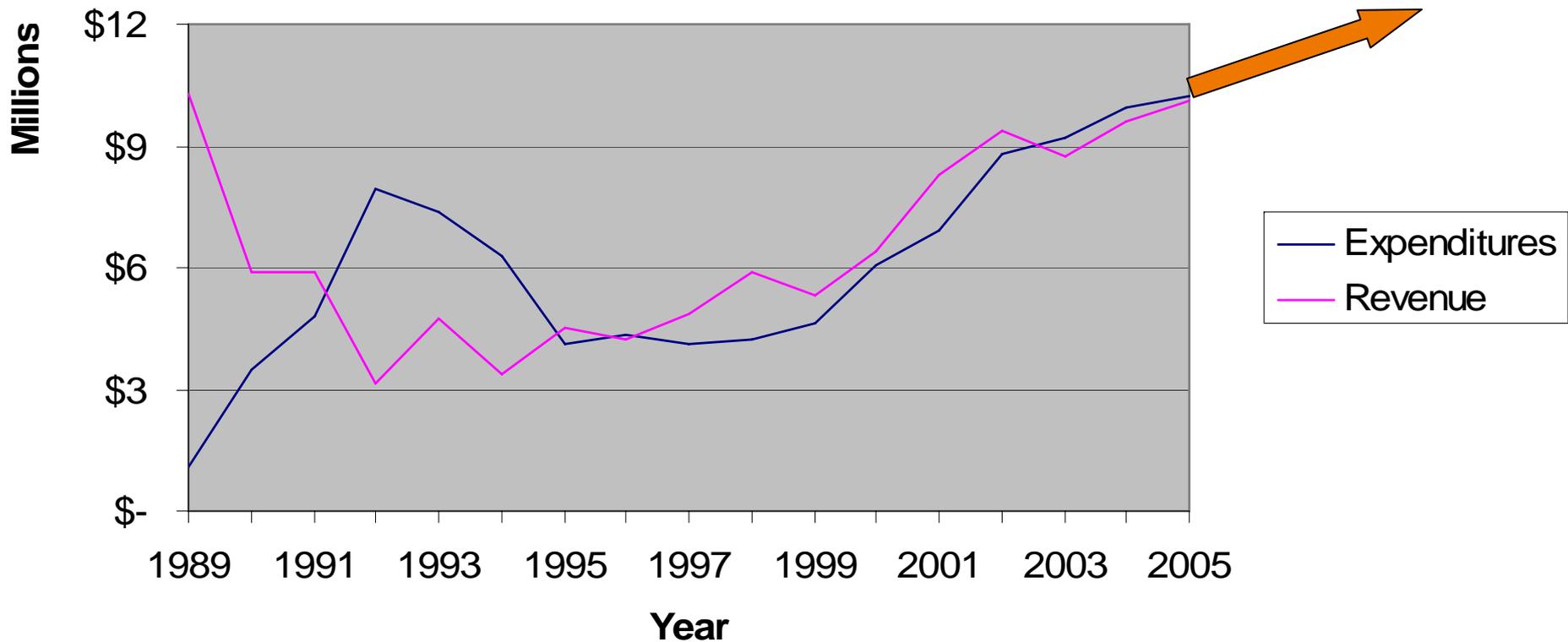

- Link them to those with useful information
- Use commercial ICT kiosks
- Get banks and business involved

RESULTS

1. "Development without donors"
(COL input \$80,000)
2. Loans of \$200,000 to 120 villagers
3. 400 more in preparation
4. 60% of farmers are women
5. Self-replicating spontaneously from
village to village
